10.30 - 11.15	Keynote Session: Indomitable Hydra: Trans-national Terrorist Threat	The threat of terrorism continues to dominate the security agenda. While the phenomenon of terrorism in it of itself is not new, the speed at which security, intelligence and law enforcement services have had to embrace the challenges in this new security environment has been at an unprecedented pace especially over the last few years. Despite the preparation that governments globally have had over the last one and a half decades since the dawn of the new era of insecurity since 11 September 2001, the present transnational terrorist threats and trends have steadily increased over the last few years. To mitigate the threat, a multi-pronged strategy that focuses on training, outreach and partnership is required. A dynamic security framework against terrorism is built on the foundation of understanding the evolving terrorism threat and expanding partnership through a multitude of networks that will ensure its sustained effectiveness against terrorism and extremism. 11.15 - 12.00	Keynote Session: Southern Thailand and its implications for security in Thailand.	Since the resurgence of violence in Southern Thailand in January 2014, corporate security teams, police and intelligence agencies from Thailand and around the world have kept a wary eye on the situation, and the consistent question asked by all has been: "Will it spread?" With the rise of IS and its ability to reach disaffected individuals, the Erawan Shrine bombing in 2015, multiple near-simultaneous explosions outside the southern provinces in August 2016, and several other explosions in Bangkok in 2016 and 2017, speculation about the spread of violence has reached new levels. However, do these events, and the apparent increase in violence levels in the south have a real impact in terms of risk outside the southern provinces? But what is more important is what lies ahead, the morphing and cross fertilisation of different jihadist strands across the continent is accelerating. The speed of this acceleration will merely increase as the Caliphate in Syria is strangled and ultimately implodes, the sooner that happens the quicker the pace of radicalisation elsewhere will increase. ISS Risk has identified several pivotal epicentres of jihadism which will impact the security landscape of Asia in the coming years.
